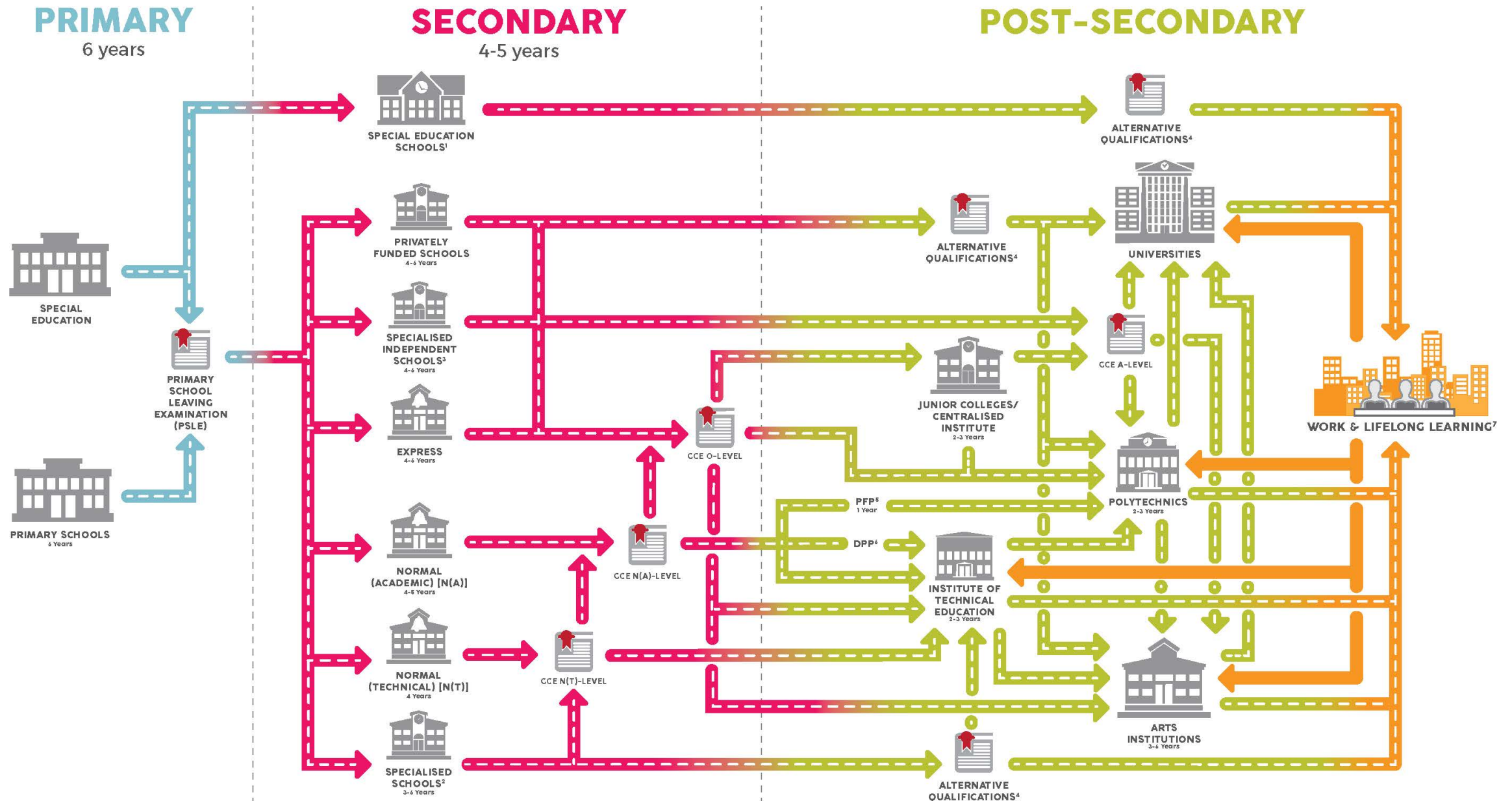

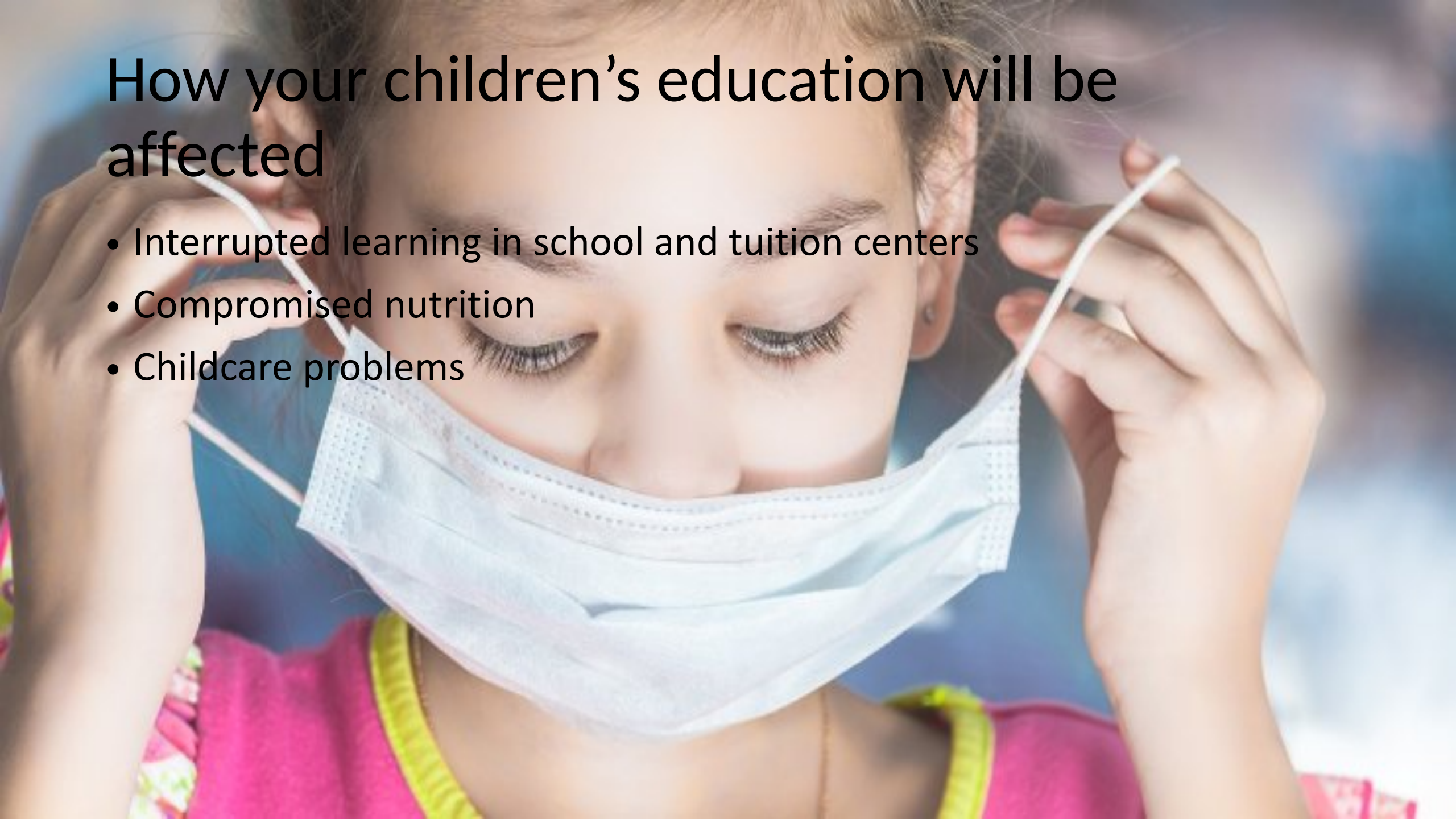

Paths Available

- 12 years
 - Kindy -> Primary School -> Secondary School -> JC/Poly -> Uni
- Accelerate by 1 to 2 years
 - 'O' Levels -> Foundation Year -> Uni
- Accelerate by 2 to 7 years
 - Maximize accreditation opportunities
 - Increase Vertical enrichment and be prudent about content /hobby / special enrichment

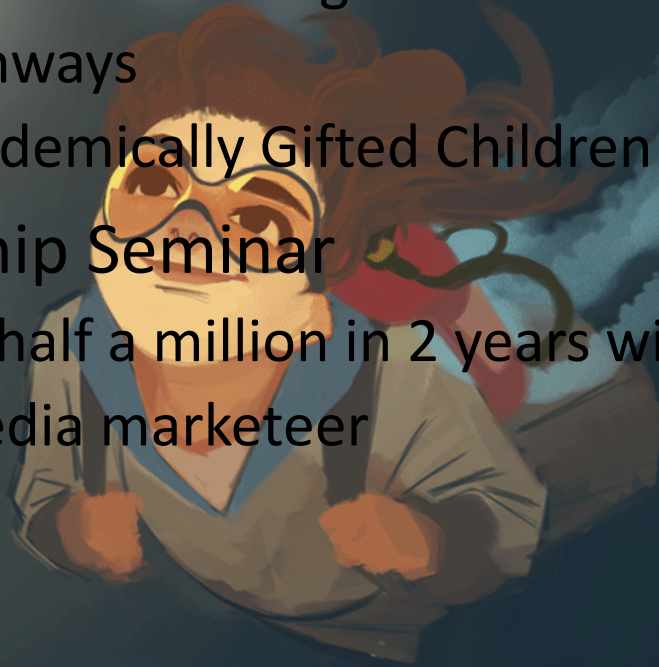

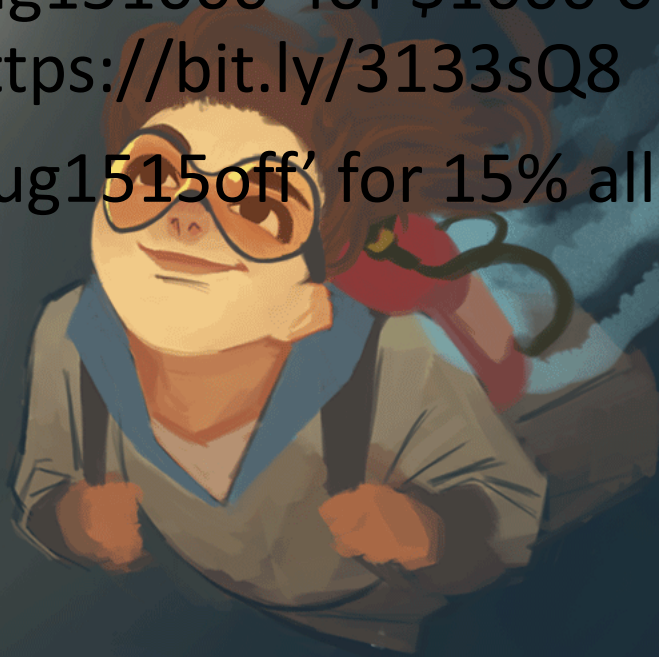
