


#### Who Am I?






#### 4 Ways of Learning Phonetical Language

"characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities." ~ Adopted by the IDA Board of Directors, Nov. 12, 2002


- Model Enthusiasm




- Never tired, never hungry

#### Training Visual Pathways

- Vision at 0 3 months
  - 8 inches from the face to several feet
  - Black, white and grey the 1<sup>st</sup> 3 months
  - First color they see: Red
- Visual stimulation with toys and surroundings
- Balancing near and far vision
- Audio pathway stimulation
  - Songs and words





#### Read-to-me

Start with flash cards and progress to books

- Find a time
- Choose a spot
- Very short exposure: start with not more than 45 seconds, many times a day
- Never bore
- Be enthusiastic


